## How you can improve the continuity of care for your patients

In this episode of the Alberta Doctors' Digest podcast, editor-in-chief Marvin Polis speaks to Dr. Carla Laidlaw about how CII/CPAR is being used in the Westview PCN to improve continuity of care.

Community Information Integration and Central Patient Attachment Registry (CII/CPAR) enhances communication amongst providers by enabling the sharing of important health care information across the province. This is made possible by a two-way connection between clinic electronic medical records (EMRs) and Alberta Netcare.

Community Information Integration (CII) is a system that allows physicians to send their community-based consult letters to Alberta Netcare.

Central Patient Attachment Registry (CPAR) identifies relationships between patients and their primary provider and sends e-notifications to providers when their patients are seen in the emergency department or have a hospital admission.

### Who is eligible to participate?

Teams of physicians, nurse practitioners and allied health providers in Alberta who are using one of the conformed EMRs can sign up for CII/CPAR. There is no cost to participate. These EMRs are:

- Accuro
- Healthquest
- Med Access
- PS Suite
- Wolf
